University of Louisiana at Lafayette™ Ring Anatomy



MARTIN HALL
Martin Hall is the main administration building on campus and is named for State Senator Robert Martin, who helped establish the university.

OAK TREES
In 1900, the university's first president and founder of the Live Oak Society, Dr. Edwin L. Stephens, planted oak trees on campus. Many still stand today and are symbolic of the university's growth, strength and endurance.

RAGIN' CAJUNS
Ragin' Cajuns® was twice voted as the top nickname in the nation and is as unique as our culture.

BRICKS
The four bricks represent the university's evolution, which is reflected in four historic name changes. They also signify the Walk of Honor, which is paved with bricks bearing the names of all graduates.

CYPRESS TREES
The cypress trees represent Cypress Lake, a unique feature of UL's campus. Cypress trees connect the university to the world since they exist on all habitable continents.



HEART AND HAND
These are the last three words of the university's alma mater.

SEAL
The university's crest represents the diverse culture and heritage of the university. The seal incorporates the Acadian and Creole flags, a shield, a pelican, oak leaves, and the Latin motto: bravely, happily, faithfully.

UL
The interlocked UL displays the initials of the university.

FLEUR-DE-LIS
As the university's primary logo, the UL fleur-de-lis, is featured as the prominent symbol on the top of the ring.



1898
More than 105,000 students have graduated from the university since it was founded in 1898.

RED STONE
The red stone represents the university's primary color, vermilion. As a naturally occurring pigment, vermilion has been used around the world for thousands of years. It is regarded as the color of life and is associated with eternity.
